Refugee Claimant	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Refugee Protection Claimant Document</li> <li>- Acknowledgement of Claim and Notice to Return for Interview</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- individual whose claim is under review by the RPD of the IRB</li> <li>- is a temporary resident until a decision is made</li> </ul>	ESL
Provincial Nominee  PNP – P - Principal Holder PNP – S - Spouse PNP – D - Dependents	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Provincial Nominee Program (PNP) Certificate &amp; Letter</li> <li>- the certificate is usually accompanied by a letter listing their dependants</li> <li>- holders of this document are usually members of the Federal Skilled Workers or in the PhD International Masters or PhD Graduate Stream</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- a Provincial Nominee and their dependants are individuals who fast-track their PR status after successful nomination by Ontario employers via PNP</li> <li>- they may apply for a temporary work permit while waiting for PR status</li> </ul>	ESL
Temporary Worker or Student	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Work or Study Permits</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- have not received initial approval of a co-existing Application of Permanent Residence</li> <li>- the words “Initial Approval of PR” are not written under the Remarks</li> <li>- the right Case Type number and/or wording are missing</li> </ul>	ESL
Live-In Caregiver Program	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Live-In Caregiver Work Permit (Approved as a Foreign Domestic Worker)</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- expired permits have been converted to Open Work Permits; because they are on a path to permanent residency they can remain in Canada and work provided their original Visa information and/or passport shows they entered Canada on a valid Live-In Caregiver Work Permit</li> </ul>	ESL

Convention Refugee/ Protected Person	<p><u>Convention Refugees (CR):</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- <a href="#">Record of Landing (IMM 1000)</a></li> <li>- <a href="#">Confirmation of Permanent Residence (IMM 5292 or IMM 5509)</a></li> <li>- <a href="#">Notice or Letter of Decision</a> (from Refugee Protection Division (RPD) of Immigration Refugee Board of Canada (IRB))</li> </ul> <p><u>Protected Persons (PP):</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- <a href="#">Pre-Removal Risk Assessment (PRRA)</a></li> <li>- <a href="#">Protected Persons Status Document (IMM5520)</a></li> <li>- urgent Protection cases enter Canada on <a href="#">Temporary Resident Permit called a <i>Permit to Come into or Remain in Canada (IMM1263)</i></a></li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- most clients are chosen abroad</li> <li>- they are Government Assisted Refugees (GARs) or Privately Sponsored Refugees (PSRs)</li> <li>- arrive with a document at port of entry to become PRs</li> <li>- some clients found to be CR within Canada by IRB</li> <li>- letters from IRCC stating protection is allowed</li> <li>- some clients are determined in Canada to be PP (eg. PRRA)</li> <li>- permit has “Protected temporary residents class” written on it</li> </ul>	LINC ELT OSLT ESL
Persons who have applied for PR status and have been informed of their initial approval by an Approved in Principle Letter from IRCC	- <a href="#">Approved in Principle Letter</a> (pending verifications)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Eligible Classes of Applicants for Permanent Residence: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Spouse or Common-law Partners in Canada Class</li> <li>▪ Humanitarian and Compassionate Grounds</li> <li>▪ Temporary Protected Person Class</li> <li>▪ Temporary Resident Permit Holders Class</li> <li>▪ other classes as determined by IRPA Regulations</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	LINC ELT OSLT ESL
Temporary Foreign Worker, or their dependant, who are approved by the Canadian Experience Class but not yet received PR status or Temporary Visitor, Worker or Student	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- <a href="#">Work or Study Permits</a> (Application for Permanent Residence Initial Approval)</li> <li>- <a href="#">Visitor Record – Case Type 17</a></li> <li>- <a href="#">Work Permit – Case Type 27</a></li> <li>- <a href="#">Study Permit – Case Type 37</a> } - <a href="#">Visitor Record, Work &amp; Study Permit</a> (Acceptable due to the 1 + 1 Rule)</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- who received initial approval of a co-existing Application of Permanent Residence</li> <li>- must have the words “Initial Approval of PR” written on it under the Remarks</li> <li>- these are acceptable due to the Case Type number and/or wording</li> <li>- any permit regardless of the Case Type number that is accompanied by a Letter of Approval is eligible due to the 1 + 1 Rule</li> </ul>	LINC ELT OSLT ESL
