POSITION: Guitar Instructor

LOCATION: 258 Hespeler Road, Cambridge

REPORTS TO: Supervisor Youth Programs

TIME COMMITMENT: One or two shifts per week

FUNCTION:

- Instruct youth on how to play the guitar (other instruments an asset).

SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Teach individual lessons as well as supervise more casual “jam sessions” in the Music Room.
- To display a professional attitude and develop positive relationships with participants, staff, and volunteers, and address concerns or questions.

QUALIFICATIONS & REQUIREMENTS:

- Know how to play the guitar.
- Ability to work with youth from many different social, cultural and economic backgrounds.
- Able to teach at different skill levels.
- Excellent customer service skills.
- Acceptable Police Records Check.

SUPPORT & TRAINING:

- An orientation for this position will be provided by the supervisor of the Youth Centre and additionally, YMCA staff will be available for assistance and ongoing support as needed.

TIME COMMITMENT DETAILS:

- One or two shifts per week, specific day TBD.
- Day(s) of the week can be negotiated based upon availability and Youth Centre Schedule.
